As we close 2024 and look ahead to 2025, we recognize the challenges facing the opera world, including a 27% drop in attendance reported by Opera America compared to pre-pandemic levels. While many companies have scaled back, Teatro Grattacielo has embraced this as an opportunity to evolve. This year marked significant growth for our organization and for me personally, as I deepened my commitment to community work through the power of opera. We expanded our programming to three productions annually, including *The Tin Angel*, inspired by New York City's historic jazz mecca, the Tin Palace, and launched our new community initiative, Opera at Gotham Park. As we continue to present opera in a relatable and accessible way, we aim to foster a new generation of enthusiasts and supporters.

Thank you for supporting our mission; we are excited to embark on this next chapter with you.

Our mission at Teatro Grattacielo is to promote the rich tradition of traditional and new opera, revitalizing lesser-known works, commissioning new operas, supporting emerging singers and creating all-inclusive community programming.



Present opera performances at major New York venues with the highest musical standards with a particular eye on innovation and multi-media arts.



Expand the audience for opera through education and community outreach programs, with particular focus on underserved communities.



Educate youth and young artists about lesser-known operas through performances, lectures, and special events. Introduce youth to opera and arts through active participation.



Assist emerging artists into developing their careers through performance opportunities.

2024 PRODUCTIONS

In 2024, Teatro Grattacielo celebrated its 30th Anniversary in New York City by adding a new direction in Season programming: expanding beyond its Italian operatic tradition by embracing rare and new American masterpieces.

To inaugurate this new artistic decision, the company produced the world premiere of *Beyond the Horizon*, based on Eugene O'Neill's Pulitzer Prize-winning play of the same title, and written by composer Nicolas Flagello, with libretto by Nicolas Flagello and Walter Simmons. Exploring the themes of hope, disillusionment, missed life opportunities and the pursuit of dreams through the story of two brothers in conflict over love and destiny, this production immersed an enthusiast audience at the historic La MaMa Share, located in the East Village in September 2024.

In 2024, our commitment to supporting young artists flourished with sold-out performances of a fresh and vibrant take on Gaetano Donizetti's *L'Elisir d'Amore* both in New York City (at The Flea Theater) and in Crete, Greece, at the Cultural and Conference Center of Heraklion.

Featuring an international cast of emerging talents, and in collaboration with Camerata Bardi Vocal Academy 2024, the production brought new energy to this timeless comic masterpiece. With captivating performances, colorful costumes, and a touch of mystery, it was an unforgettable celebration of opera's enduring charm and the bright future of its rising stars.



Revenue breakdown



WHAT'S NEXT

Opera at Gotham Park

Teatro Grattacielo partners with Gotham Park to create free, multidisciplinary programs for young artists (15–18) in Summer 2025. This collaboration blends opera, skate culture, and underrepresented voices to foster inclusivity and creative exchange.

Daniel Asia: The Tin Angel

The Tin Angel Opera, written to a libretto by <u>Paul Pines</u> and based on his widely acclaimed novel of the same name, with music by award-winning composer <u>Daniel Asia</u>, is set in the edgy world of a NYC downtown Bowery jazz club, where a unique cast of characters play out their dramatic story as a call for redemption. The inspiration behind the story is <u>The Tin Palace</u>, the real-life New York City's jazz mecca of the 70s, founded by Paul Pines in 1973. Conducted by <u>Enrico Fagone</u> and directed by <u>Chloe Treat</u>.

Pietro Mascagni: L'Amico Fritz

Teatro Grattacielo brings back Pietro Mascagni's charming verismo opera, L'Amico Fritz. This revival aims to introduce a wider audience to the rarely performed masterpiece, last presented by the company in 2021 during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic. The opera will be directed by Anna Laura Miszerak.

W.A.Mozart: Le Nozze Di Figaro

The season concludes with Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's *Le Nozze di Figaro*, showcasing emerging international talent in three performances. Conducted by Mexican pianist and conductor <u>Abdiel Vásquez</u>, with direction by Teatro Grattacielo's Artistic Director, <u>Stefanos Koroneos</u>, this production promises a dynamic and fresh interpretation of the classic opera.
